

Campus and Buildings

Windsor Mountain's 150 acres of woods and shaded lawns are spread out over a low hill about five minutes' walk from the business section of Lenox. The setting is one of the most picturesque in Western Massachusetts, with beautiful country estates adjoining the school property and the pine-studded Berkshires rising in the distance. Lenox is located on US Route 9 between Pittsfield and Stockbridge and is about 140 miles from both New York and Boston. It is easily accessible by car over good roads and parkways or by New York Central or Boston and Maine trains.

Focal point of campus activity is the *Main House*. This spreading, ivy-covered brick structure contains comfortable lounges, recreation rooms, a library, classrooms, the administrative offices, the infirmary, the dining room and kitchen, and attractive dormitories for the older girls (Grades 10, 11, and 12). Dr. Gertrude Bondy's apartment is also in this building.

Uphill behind the Main House stands *Beaupre*, a typical New England house with white clapboard siding and dark green shutters. Primarily a dormitory for the younger boys (Grades 7, 8, and 9), it also contains classrooms and the music department. Nearby is the *Beaupre Stage*, which contains a raised stage and dressing rooms as well as an arts and crafts studio and the Shop. Also in the vicinity is the *Lodge*, home of the girls in Grades 7, 8, and 9.
